By Car

From North/South: Head east/west along the A1 past Lobley Hill. Merge into the A184 and head east towards the A6082 (Redheugh Bridge). Slight left at A695 (Scotswood Road). Head south toward A695 (Plummer Street). Turn left at A395 (Railway Street). Entrance to Times Square Car Park is on the right, and the Centre for Life is directly ahead.

By Train/Bus

We are located just 200 yards away from Newcastle's Central Railway Station which has passenger rail connections to all of the UK's main cities and towns.

The Metro underground system also runs through this station with trains running every few minutes to areas of Newcastle, Gateshead, North Tyneside, South Tyneside and Sunderland. More information on the Metro system, its stops and timetables go to www.tyneandwearmetro.co.uk

A number of local bus services operating from Newcastle, North Tyneside, Gateshead and Durham stop in the street outside the Central Station. For more info visit www.simplygo.com for bus fare and timetable information.

By Foot

Newcastle is a very compact city and can be easily walked, from one side to the other, in less than 15 minutes. The Centre is located just 200 yards to the left of Newcastle's Central Station and is very centrally located in the city.

By Air

Newcastle International Airport is just 6 miles from the city centre, 15 minutes by car, and has connecting scheduled flights to all major UK airports. In addition, the Airport is served by the Metro trains which run via Newcastle Central Station.

Parking

Times Square Car Park is the Centre's multi-storey car park, located adjacent to the Centre on Railway Street. The car park has 635 spaces, costing £1.00 an hour.

How to find us in the Centre

The CLRN Office can be found on the Second Floor (South Wing) of the Bioscience Centre – entrance marked with the purple arrow on the map opposite. Once you are in the Centre, head towards the Bioscience Centre – the curved building opposite the bars and science museum.
